<u>Missions Team</u> will provide resources, connect churches, and facilitate NBA churches to partner in outreach, ministry, and church planting in the NBA and beyond. This team will work with Disaster Relief, World Changers, Evangelism, CWJC, Toy Store, RAs, partnerships, and WMU.

<u>Church Planting Team</u> will identify strategic areas to begin new churches. They will identify new people groups and population segments, and will work with existing churches providing training and coaching for every stage of starting a new work from the dream stage to the planting stage. Will provide a bi-monthly gathering for church planters. Will work together with the Mission Team when the need arises.

<u>Revitalization Team</u> will identify plateaued and dying churches in the NBA. They will offer assistance to these churches by providing resources and training. They will also develop a process for churches to partner together. They will continue to develop the legacy church and repurposing method of revitalization.

- ⇒ We will create an Ethnic Ministry Team representing the 31 ethnic congregations.

- ⇒ The NBA office will be the first and best choice for partnering churches to seek resourcing.
- ⇒ Church members praying for all their neighbors during 2018

Let's keep the doors of the church open because statistics say that 70 churches close their doors each week in the U.S.

We have received many wonderful reports from City Reach Nashville projects. Here are just a few:

<u>Northwood Baptist Church</u>: Pastor Mitch Mullenax reported that on June 17, 2018, Southwood Baptist Church, Tulsa, OK brought 42 volunteers to go door-to-door throughout Northwood's community canvassing for people interested in coming to the church. Pastor Mitch said one of the best results of this project was that his own members said, "Hey, we could do that!" This has led to a renewed evangelism emphasis at his

church.

<u>Bell Road Baptist Church</u>, along with other volunteers from nearby churches, had its first mission VBS at the nearby The Vistas apartment complex on July 14th. Youth pastor John Wallan reported, "The response from the community was fantastic. Thirty-six youth and children registered for VBS. Many more parents showed up as well. We now have a list of names and families from The Vistas to pray for and contact."

<u>New Season Church:</u> Pastor Dwayne Lewis reported that 37 volunteers from the Pittsburg Freewill Baptist Church, Pittsburg, IL canvassed the nearby Parkwood Village Apartments on June 11-14. Three people accepted Christ as Savior and one has been baptized, so far. Thirty children came to the VBS event through the summer food program with crafts, games and Gospel presentations.

<u>Faith Baptist Church, Madison</u>: Pastor Jerry Jones reported that a volunteer team from Hillvue Heights Baptist Church, Bowling Green, KY came June 10-15 and knocked on 630 doors in the nearby Gateway Community. Several weeks later, a lady from one of these homes brought her handbill to the Faith Baptist Church with a serious need to be rescued from a violent family situation. The pastor and his church were able to reach out to this family and intervene.

Men's Director David Lyon of Cedar Hill Baptist Church in Cedar Hill, Tennessee, has led his men's group to take up three of the *City Reach Nashville* construction projects for **Mt. Olive Baptist Church**, **Berryville Baptist Church** and **Liberty Baptist Church**. They will provide much needed repairs to these local churches.

Thank you to our NBA leadership team, TBMB Volunteer Mission staff, TBMB WMU, NBA churches, and the churches who have come to Nashville to serve.

Above all, I thank our Heavenly Father for the hearts He has touched to respond willingly and sacrificially. Church Planting Strategist

It's been a really busy year in the church planting department at the Nashville Baptist Association. The highlights include: five new churches, a conference aimed at longevity in ministry, a summer missions camp, multiple church planter fellowships, a Basic Training Weekend, planter assessments, and lots of coffee and contacts with planters and pastors around town.

The five new church plants that the NBA helped plant and support this year include:

Grace Story Church - pastored by Ryan Coatney City of Refuge Church - pastored by Chad Hutton South Nashville Church - pastored by Bill Blair New Day Church - pastored by James Dean The Gathering at 840 - pastored by Gene Mims

In March of this year, the Nashville Baptist Association helped put on a conference called "We Do Not Lose Heart." This conference was specifically aimed at helping foster longevity in ministry. The event was put on in partnership with Grace Community Church, Resonate Church, Trinity Church, and Redeemer Church. The turnout was tremendous and included 60-70 pastors and leaders from around Middle Tennessee. Probably the most exciting part of this conference was the wide range of people who attended and were encouraged.

During the summer, the NBA helped put on a mission camp called "Immerse" that brought student ministries from around the country to Nashville to partner with our church plants. The camp had approximately 70 students involved who served around our city and specifically came to work with New Season Church and Grace Story Church. Haywood Hill Baptist Church hosted the event, Hermitage Hills provided the shower trailer, Aarron Schwartz of Restoration Church preached, and the worship band from 24 Church helped lead in worship. It went great!

Over the past year, we had bimonthly church planter fellowships that had an average of 15-20 people in attendance. During these fellowships, we were encouraged by men including Daniel Eum, Andy Adkison, Scott Thomas, Craig Brown, and Gary Morgan.

We had a Church Planters Basic Training event this year with three different church planting teams represented. Additionally, we helped assess and coach multiple church planters, and I met personally with over 55 church planters/pastors throughout the city.

This was a busy, productive, exciting year!

Our meetings have been to discuss how best we can serve the churches in their area of growth and leading. Jack, as you may know, retired earlier this year, so we are currently not meeting. Revitalization Team

The past year has seen the NBA Church Revitalization Team move from the conceptual to the actual work of helping churches move toward revitalization. During the beginning phases of the CRT, the focus was on definitions and process. After much discussion we landed on an approach that focused not on prescribing a plan but on helping churches discover God's plan for their church. As we focused on this approach, God led us to the following:

<u>Discovery Process</u>: The CRT developed a process to help churches discover God's plan for them. The process involves members from the CRT walking with leaders of churches helping them to evaluate their congregation, the community, and church organization. As the church is evaluated, the CRT helps lead the church and its leaders to focus on prayer as they seek God's will for their church. This discovery process can be adapted for churches that have pastors as well as those without. The CRT began utilizing this process with churches this year.

NAMB in order to learn more about their Replant process. According to NAMB, a replant can come in many forms, but the focus is on renewing the work and vision of churches that are on a course toward eventual death. Most often these churches give up some degree of control to a leadership team, the association, or partnering church in order to receive greater help and make the necessary changes so the church can replant itself in the community where it already resides. NAMB has even developed a specific assessment process to evaluate pastors who feel led to this type of work. With help from NAMB, the NBA began a replant process with a church as they are seeking to call an assessed replanting pastor. If you believe your church is moving toward eventual death, please contact the CRT and we can help you examine the options available for replanting your church in your community so your church might continue its ministry for years to come.

Church Planting Team

Team Leader: Ben Adkison

Our church planting team had a really good year as we met together and oversaw church planting ministry for the NBA.

Earlier this year, the team saw significant changes, as Mike Cunningham, who led for several years, took a new ministry position and had to step down. The team didn't miss a beat and is currently composed of: Ben Adkison – 24 Church, Chris Royalty – 24 Church, Gary Morgan – Mosaic Church, Aarron Schwartz – Restoration Church, Dwayne Lewis – New Season Church, Scott Patty – Grace Community Church, Mike Harder – The Gospel Church, and Dan Harder – The Gospel Church.

During our monthly meetings, the team spent time strategizing how to better recruit, assess, train, coach, and meaningfully partner with church planters in the greater Nashville area. The NBA currently does all of these things in some fashion; however, we are always seeking to more thoroughly prepare planters for the tough journey of church planting.

Over the past year, the NBA helped plant five new churches:

Grace Story Church - pastored by Ryan Coatney City of Refuge Church - pastored by Chad Hutton South Nashville Church - pastored by Bill Blair New Day Church - pastored by James Dean The Gathering at 840 - pastored by Gene Mims

All of these churches have received training, coaching, or equipping from the NBA, and all of them are regularly involved in Church Planting Fellowships and other NBA sponsored / led events.

Our team has currently identified 21 different planting priority areas around the city. While all of these neighborhoods have churches, some of them even new churches, we still feel that more are needed to meet the growing population boom in Nashville. A major win for the team this year was helping Grace Community Church, Resonate Church, Trinity Church, and Redeemer Church (all NBA church plants currently or in the past) help put on a well-attended conference called "We Do Not Lose Heart." The aim of this conference was to encourage and equip church leaders for longevity in ministry.

All in all, it was a great, productive year!

World Changers 2018 Theme:



On June 16-21, 2018, approximately 230 students and adults converged on Nashville for the 2018 World Changers Combo event. Seventeen crews completed work with seven church plants and nine construction sites and impacted countless lives in our city for God's kingdom.

This year, Davidson Academy served as the lodging site for the students, leaders, chaperones and staff, providing space for participants to sleep and eat and a venue for worship and fellowship.

Church Planting



This year, eight ministry teams partnered with seven church plants/ replants in the Nashville area. The church plants involved included:

- Eastland Baptist Church
- Liberty Baptist Church
- New Day Church
- New Season Church
- Real Life Church
- The Church at Woodbine
- 24 Church

Each church planter helps determine the scope of ministry that takes place during the week based on the needs and strategy of the church he is planting. This means that some plants work with ministry teams to offer backyard Bible clubs or Vacation Bible School, some do light construction, some canvass neighborhoods, and some put on block parties or free car washes, among other ministries.

The church planting ministry has proven to be an impactful event for churches and church planters year after year. In some cases, it helps foster significant partnership and ministry for many years between the people and churches involved.

Combo Project Here and Now

Nine ministry crews worked at construction sites in the Nashville area to complete projects that included:

7 porches, decks, and wheelchair ramps and **1** walkway were repaired or built

1 ministry building was painted

3 homes were repaired by World Changers through demolition, painting, and structural repairs

The final statistics for the Nashville Combo event were:

Thank you, Judson Baptist Church and Tulip Grove Baptist Church for hosting the volleyball league.


Basketball


Impacting Lives

"A life is not important except in the impact it has on other lives" — Jackie Robinson

The important work of Begin Anew in 2017 impacted the lives of 307 under-resourced adults and 175 of their children. The outcome of investing in these lives has resulted in several significant agency milestones.

Our educational classes enrolled the largest number of persons and graduated the largest number of students in the 21 years of our existence. A new satellite was established in South Nashville; we designed and implemented High School Equivalency (HSE) classes for ELL students, and we launched a fair trade World Craft artisan group to employ refugees as they make crafts and learn English (worldcrafts.org/artisans/begin-anew-refugeeartisan-group).



For 40 years, in six cities, I have led community faith-based nonprofits toward the purpose of positively impacting the lives of economically struggling individuals. For the past 18 years, I have been honored and blessed to lead Begin Anew to accomplish this vision in Middle Tennessee.

During my time of leadership, more than 567 volunteers have served, and together we have raised \$6 million to provide educational classes, mentors and services to impact the lives of 4,678 individuals. The budget has grown from \$25,000 to more than \$700,000. We have grown from one location to seven satellites and from one staff member to a staff of twelve. The infrastructure is strong and nimble and the present staff is equipped and trained in an evidence-based holistic approach that help individuals build bridges out of poverty.

In June of 2018, I retired from the position of Executive Director for Begin Anew to pursue part-time opportunities as a coach, consultant, and trainer with individuals and nonprofits. I will continue to serve individuals who are underserved and those who serve them.

The organization and board is prepared for this transition. They will identify and choose a new executive director to impact the 15% of our population in need of our services to "overcome the obstacles caused by poverty."

Thank you for the opportunity and blessing to impact lives in Middle Tennessee for the past 18 years.

Record Number of Participants Graduate

Begin Anew held two graduation ceremonies in 2017 (June 3rd and December 9th) at Nashville First Baptist Church. A total of 57 students graduated with 28 earning their High School Equivalency (HSE) diplomas, 20 completing English Language Skills, four completing Computer/Job Skills training along with five goal graduates. Three students received scholarship awards allowing them to continue their education at college or trade school.

Missions

Outreach

Guatemala Partnership

What a blessing it was for me to lead the NBA's April 2018 medical mission team to Guatemala City. Our team consisted of five local Nashville area healthcare providers (including two nurse practitioners, a registered nurse, an ultra sonographer, and a med-surgical nurse), as well as two local pastors. Through the Guatemalan Baptist Convention, we partnered with a local Baptist church in Guatemala City to host a week-long medical clinic for residents living near the church building. During our week, our team was able to see approximately 600 patients with medical needs including skin problems, intestinal

disorders, and orthopedic challenges, and we were even blessed to notify a few young ladies that they were pregnant.

Guatemala City is a unique area. The city itself is not entirely third-world, but there are certainly pockets of poverty. Approximately 80 percent of the population stops attending school after sixth grade, mostly due to embarrassment over not being able to obtain the necessary school supplies. Many of the young men face the risks of a culture wrought with addiction and organized crime. Those who are fortunate enough to avoid such dangers will often leave the area in search of steady work. For these reasons, there is a vacuum of male leadership in local Guatemalan churches. Of the roughly 600 people that our medical team ministered to, it is likely that only 10 to 12 of them were working-age men. Please pray that God will raise up a generation of male leadership in the Guatemalan church who will seek Him with all of their heart and lead their families and congregations to do the same.

The ministry model that we used was patterned directly after the Master Himself. Jesus often met people's physical needs as a means to address their spiritual needs. After you have demonstrated to someone that you care enough to help them with an illness or other ailment or challenge, more often than not, you have their attention and an opportunity to speak about spiritual matters with them. It was a blessing to see the pastor and several deacons from the local church with their Bibles open, sharing God's Word with everyone who passed through the medical clinic. In addition, every person was given a gospel tract to read and invited to attend one of the several worship services held throughout the week.

Please commit to pray for missionaries everywhere, at home and abroad, short-term and long-term. Please pray for their safety. Please pray for them to be bold for the gospel. And please pray that God's Word is received and that lost people are saved.

Construction

Through your support you have joined in the work of the Nashville Baptist Association. The NBA provided the funds to build an apartment for the pastor and his family, along with the purchase of a washing machine for the seminary.

Imagine accompanying the mission team to Guatemala City, home to 3 million of Guatemala's 16.5 million people. Pass through the tense moments of the immigration line to enter into the heat of the day, the press of people, and the waiting arms of your newfound brothers and sisters in Christ. Hop aboard a bus to merge into the frightening closeness of congested traffic while the sting of diesel

fumes waters your eyes and burns your lungs. Step off your bus at the door of "Jesus Is Lord" Baptist Church.

The building is old but substantial. This beacon of hope rests amid some of the poorest people of the city. Now it is time to load the weight of work onto your shoulders and begin to build. Each 50-plus-pound bag of cement must be lumbered up three steep flights of steps. Grab a shovel to manually mix. Take your mind, a pencil, and a scrap of cardboard to set the plans in motion. You are building a space that will be used for Bible learning and worship. Allow your mind to expand into visions of decades as you sketch out the future of this space. Yes, you are building this space. Yes, you have been in Guatemala.



She said, "Elevate is like my second home, and these guys are like my family."
