

*Met with Keith Cooks and David Brandon with On The Go Ministry to set up opportunities to partner with churches. They have a live nativity scene that we discussed using at a new church plant. Along with some other outreach ideas. We did have an outside festival which included the live nativity scene.

*Connected with 3 potential church planters

*Started a mission work in Paddock apt complex with a planter and his wife called, "Winner's Circle.'

*Connected with over 50 church planters and pastors via email, phone, text, lunches and dinner.

*Presented NBA plaques and bibles to three churches during their Sunday morning services.

*Spoke on a Sunday morning at two new churches (United Family Fellowship, Nehemiah M.B. church) that joined the NBA and shared the benefits to their congregations.

*Had three church planter's fellowships and have had over 28 in attendance.

*Planned "Overcoming Barriers for Church Growth" for Bi-vocational Pastor's brunch on a Saturday. Had 14 in attendance.

*Walked along side three churches to join the NBA; United Family Fellowship Baptist Church, Movement Church and Nehemiah MB Church.

*Planned and arranged Fuge Camp to work with Pastor Hunter at the Boys and Girls club for two weeks. There was over 150 kids impacted.

*Walked alongside the new elected Pastor of Mt. Olive MB Church in Charlotte, TN., Antonio Collier. Met with his deacons and discussed NBA and future trainings for church growth.

*Attended the installation service for Pastor Collier and presented a Bible to the pastor from the NBA staff, that was signed by our DOM Rusty Sumrall.

•Met with church planting team and discussed what's next for planters.

*Introduced the NBA mapping center to churches and they have been using this program.

*Revisited the Church planting priority areas and it is exciting to see the areas we are planting churches.

*Setting a date for Basic Training for new church plants and existing churches that desire to enhance their team philosophy and discipleship strategies.

*Met with Charles Grant and potential planter

*Assisted New Life Church in securing \$3,000 stipend for outreach from TBMB.

*Created new brochure for our Revitalization Team.

*JoAnn and I are currently working on a new directory for church planters. This directory will have pictures of the planters, wife, etc.

*Working on a list of church planting steps when they join the NBA that will be added to new church packet.

*Working on new "existing" church process steps and what it means to be an existing church joining the NBA.

*Rusty and I have worked with Lewis McMullen to create a seamless process for churches to join the State Convention without going through another process. When they join the NBA they will be signed up by us for TBMB then we will give them their SBC number.

*RightNow media has 90% of our churches using it.

*I have worked on a Drip Campaign with Right Now media so that every month there is a topic of study.

May-June – Pastoral Support/Encouragement

July-August - Church Planting

September-October – Focus on Connections – Connecting churches to churches for ministry

November-December – Church Revitalization

*Attended NAMB Revitalization Conference

*Invite planters and pastors to the NAMB Pastor's luncheon

*Worked with Fuge Camp, Brentwood Baptist (Mission 615), City Reach and Pittsburgh Freewill Baptist Church, Coggins Ave Baptist Church, and planned and developed strategies to engage our communities for Christ. This work will start in June 2019.

We are thankful to the Lord for all He has done in the harvest field of Nashville Baptist Association through the City Reach Nashville program. City Reach Nashville began two years ago to enable churches from across the state to join in the work of God by coming alongside church plants, ethnic churches and churches going through revitalization. These ministry opportunities included:

Block parties, Construction Projects, Prayer Walking, Back Yard Bible clubs, Ethnic Group Research, Sports Camps, English Tutoring, Student Ministry, Church Planting, Evangelism, VBS, College Outreach, Music and many more ministries determined by the volunteer groups.

We have been able to work with 70 volunteer contacts across the state of Tennessee and beyond who indicated an interest in coming to Nashville on a mission trip. We had a total of 45 different City Reach Nashville requests from our NBA churches the past two years.

So far this year, we have completed 25 different City Reach Projects such as:

June 2-8: Coggin Avenue Baptist Church from Brownwood, TX stayed at Faith Madison. Half their team worked on a VBS at Faith Madison and Pastor Jerry Jones and half of the team worked with New Season Church and Pastor Dwayne Lewis for evangelism projects and youth choir performance.

June 22-29: Haven Heights Baptist Church of Wauseon, OH and First Baptist Church Perrysville, OH stayed at Bell Road Baptist Church. They spent the days working on construction projects at the Nashville Baptist Association office: cleaning and filling in the cracks in the parking lot, painting the front stair well, cleaning out, repairing and painting the storage garage, cleaning out closets, shredding old files and papers, etc. In the evenings they worked with the Zomi Baptist Church and the Zomi Pastor's Conference meeting at Mt. View Baptist Church. They led a VBS for the children.

June 23-28: Pittsburg Freewill Baptist Church worked with Pastor Dwayne Lewis at New Season Church for evangelism projects at a nearby housing area.

July 6-11: Trinity Baptist Church, Jonesborough, TN helped First Baptist Church Antioch with their VBS projects.

July 13: Salem Baptist Association brought a Youth Team to Bell Road Baptist Church for an International VBS day and evangelism party at a nearby multi-ethnic apartment complex.

July 13-19: Weekly Baptist Association brought a team of 30 to repair the Disaster Relief garage at FBC Donelson and complete a number of construction projects at the NBA building.

We still have four more months to complete City Reach Nashville and we look forward to all the Lord wants to continue to do through the Nashville Baptist Association.

People Group Report for the NBA Book of Reports 2019

Nashville has become a center for immigration in the United States. The Nashville Baptist Association has a great opportunity to fulfill our calling to take the gospel to the ends of the earth by reaching out to the large immigrant population right here at home. Immigrants are moving to Nashville because of the low cost of living and the large employment opportunities. Nashville's largest immigrant groups include Mexicans, Kurds, Vietnamese, Laotians, Arabs, and Somalis. There are also smaller communities of Pashtuns from Afghanistan and Pakistan concentrated primarily in Antioch.

Currently, least 90+ people groups in the greater Nashville region, and over 150 languages spoken. Our long term desire to see at least one church planted among the every people group in Nashville. We currently have over 20 churches planted among different ethnic groups in Nashville, but there is much work to be done.

According to a recent city government survey, Nashville has the largest Kurdish community in the United States, numbering approximately 11,000. A major concern for the city government is that Nashville is home to a growing number of residents who speak English "less than very well." By the latest Metro estimate, it's nearly 10 percent of residents, meaning that more than 60,000 people are conversing in Spanish, Arabic, Somali or other languages. This provides a great opportunity for Nashville Baptist Association churches to begin English as a Second Language classes to reach these people groups.

One highlight this year was Pastor Gin Piang of the United Zomi Baptist Church planned an annual meeting of the Zomi Language pastors from Nepal. At the invitation of Pastor David Outlaw, they had their annual meeting at the Mt. View Baptist Church, June 25, 26 and 27. Pastor Gin requested that City Reach Nashville provide a volunteer team to come and help take care of the children in the evening sessions. Pastor Lance Wyse of Haven Heights Baptist Church, Wauseon, OH brought a team of 12 and Pastor Jeff Woolum of First Baptist Church Perrysburg, OH brought a team of 6. They stayed at Bell Road Baptist Church for the week. In the evenings, they held an AWANAs program for 40-50 Zomi children. Pastor Gin said the pastors and wives were thrilled to have their children taught by English speaking Christians and that the whole experience was a true blessing. Pastor Gin reported a total attendance of 250, including 89 Zumi language pastors from around the United States and 11 coming from Burma for this conference. We praise the Lord that City Reach Nashville was able to participate in this international conference in Nashville.

Church Planting Team

Dwayne Lewis

It has been a rewarding year for church planting branch at the Nashville Baptist Association. We have assisted in planting the Movement Church and Shiloh Baptist Church. We assisted by identifying locations, assessing planters and wife, training leaders and securing funding in order to see faithful congregations in every community in Middle Tennessee.

The church planting team and I are here to assist, empower, and unlock the potential of church planters in order to establish kingdom growth. We support planters in planning and strategizing inside the walls of their church and outside the walls of their church with the greatest evangelistic methods. We find value in finding effective ways to establish the church to healthy church model.

With the increase in population in the "It City" Nashville, we are striving to unlock the potential, passion and creativity in church planters. We are here to walk alongside of planters assisting them in finding new ways to serve their communities to reach lost people. In Nashville alone, there's about 120 people moving here a day.

It is important to know that in Tennessee there is an average of 50-60 thousand people moving to Tennessee a year. There is 4 million lost people in a population of 6 million. Statistics say there are 1000 unchurched people for every SBC church in Tennessee. There are 145 people groups with 45 of them being less than 2 percent reached. One more reason church planting is needed is an average of 15-25 TBC Churches are closing per year.

I understand the greatest conventional and unconventional way to reach the unchurched is having new churches reach a new diverse people. One study revealed established SBC baptized 3.4 people per 100 resident members while new churches baptized 11.7. Church planting is still important!

During the summer the NBA sponsored a mission camp called Engage Nashville that partnered with Coggins Ave Baptist Church, Pittsburgh Free Will Baptist Church, and a Fuge Camp . The churches served in two (2) apartment complexes, and the Boys and Girls club. We had approximately 60 students and chaperones that served in order to expand the kingdom of God. Thanks to Laura Price and Phillip Howard for leading worship and the New Season Church flag dancers.

I want to thank Grace Church, Bell Road Baptist Church, and Faith Madison for hosting our churches during Engage Nashville months.

We had bimonthly church planters gatherings that averaged approximately 20 in attendance. These gatherings were times to share stories, ask questions and dialogue with other church planters.

In addition, we had Basic Training workshops for church planters and their leadership. This training consisted of how to cast your vision, stewardship, evangelism, administration and more.

Ministers Wives Ministry Becky Sumrall

In January 2019 I began to serve as the volunteer Ministers Wives Strategist for Nashville Baptist Association. As the wife of a pastor, a coach, a ministry leader, and mentor to women the Lord has equipped me through the years for this ministry.

I began by getting acquainted with Ministers Wives. I invited them to my home for *Teas*, to gather at restaurants for *Chats and Chews*, and to meet with me individually. I conducted a survey to learn how NBA could best encourage and supportive them.

The 2019- 2020 NBA Ministers Wives activities and events reflect the results on the survey. Our theme this year is *Flourishing*. This was planned by the NBA Ministers Wives Planning Team. I serve as the chair of the team and the members are Sherly Dean (pastor's wife of New Day Church) and Janet Shrum (pastor's wife of Inglewood Baptist Church). The Team: The NBA has formed a Church Strengthening Team (CST) that is comprised of local pastors and lay leaders who are committed to conveying next level initiatives and transformation that activates ripple effects of church growth and new life.

The Approach: The CST is here to work with you and get clarity through hearing your story of the current condition of the church. It's at that intersection we map out what's next. We are not here to dominate, we are here to coach, identify, advise and do ministry with you. Through that information exchange, the CST will develop and provide a customized strategy to dig the wells of living water again in your church (Genesis 26:18).

Let's collaborate and create a path for church growth together. Please don't hesitate to contact our CST.

The Fundamentals: Churches that seek help must consider the following fundamentals:

First, there is not a quick or an easy answer. Understanding your story is our first task. Strengthening your church requires change, which can be time consuming and difficult.

Secondly, the team will get an accurate picture of the church's current condition and create a church portfolio.

Thirdly, CST will give recommendations, toward "What is God's best for the church?'

Finally, when the CST has done its due diligence in assessing the condition of the church, then we communicate the findings to congregations in a helpful way.

Several thousand "stocking stuffer" toys were distributed — 6 to 8 per child.

Stuffed animals were donated and distributed.

From the Fruit and Candy room, each child received a bag with gift wrap, tissue paper, ribbons, and candy. Each family received one roll of wrapping paper per child, a roll of tape, gift tags, gift bags, and a spool of ribbon, as well as rice and/or beans, canned food, and various other food items.

Most families received a game or puzzle, a stuffed toy, several books, and a Bible.

Parents received several family gifts. Many parents were provided a ride to their home.

The parents received counseling prior to shopping.

Children 0-3 years old received three to four toys, a book, and an item of clothing.

Many children 0-1 also received blankets or diapers.

Children 4-11 years old received one major and two to three minor toys.

Many 4- to 11-year-old children received items of clothing.

Children 12-18 years old (teens) received three to four items.

The Toy Store served children from newborn to age 18 and served 290 families with a total of 816 children.

Most of the families served reside in the 37206 zip code area, and the remaining were pastoral referrals and from Begin Anew.

Approximately 150 volunteers, including workers from many NBA churches, served at this year's toy store. Several workers were first-timers.

Two shoppers made decisions for Christ this year.

To do that contact myself and I will be happy to walk you through what you need to do. I will make sure you have the training you need to be successful and to begin to build a foundation for the future.




Mapping Center 2019 JoAnn Howard



Thankfulness. Been reflecting on how our attitude of gratitude not only affects our everyday lives but also our relationship with God. Jesus healed 10 men with leprosy and only one came back to say thanks. The others no doubt still enjoyed the blessing of healing and restored honor, but missed the best part of a life giving relationship with Jesus that starts with being thankful for who he is and what he has done. Here is what we are thankful for, as we plow forward in pointing people to the only One who heals, redeems and makes all things new...

Thankful for Renewed Lives in Broken Places. Visiting one of our teams during the aftermath of a devastating earthquake last month highlighted not only the challenging times we live in, but also the messiness of life and ministry here. How do we respond in an empowering way to the overwhelming needs around us? How do we stay focused on what God has called us to do with so many things demanding our time and energy? Despite the challenging questions that surface in messy situations, we are thankful for the way our team is staying the course and serving their community as beacons of light and hope. Good stuff is happening. Spiritual openness pervades the island. People have come to faith. New faith communities have emerged. Leaders pressing on in hard times. Thankful.

Thankful for new breakthroughs. We are excited by what God has in store for the people group who live 5 hours down the road from us. Currently there are no known believers among this unreached and previously unengaged people group. Through our business platform we have been able to explore the region and build new friendships. During our recent trip there, we met a local fisherman who invited us back to his house to drink coffee and meet his family. As we sat there listening to his stories and sharing our own, I was encouraged that it is only a matter of time before we get to witness the first family come to know and follow our King! In our city, we have begun a discovery bible study (DBS) with a young couple from another unreached people group. We are encouraged by their openness to spiritual truth and are beginning to see them invite others to learn as well.

Thankful for 'interruptions'. Every Wednesday morning I gather with a few young men for surf and prayer at our local beach. Last week as we were about to begin our prayer time, we were 'interrupted' by a young guy who came and just stood and stared at us. He said he had never seen a foreigner before and was curious about what we were doing. We asked some questions about his life and discovered he was a 12 year old orphan who had fled an abusive relative's home and now sleeps on the street in the local market. We shared about the Father's love for him and invited him to join us to study a story about Jesus calming the storm. He had never heard of Jesus before but could relate to the fear of his disciples in the face of terrifying times. As we continue to meet and learn more, I'm reminded of the importance of being open to those 'interruptions' that God sends our way.
