


Executive Director

Church Planting Strategist

Dwayne Lewis

Our church planting philosophy is to see new churches planted throughout every community in Nashville, TN. With all the growth and gentrification, Nashville has been identified with new names like, the Athens of the South, Music City, the "It" City and The Other Coast. Year after year we see the expansion of the boarders of Nashville, and it is reported that out of all the cities in U.S.A., Nashville is ranked twenty-third (23rd) by population.

We know God is still at work in Nashville, and we want to join Him on His mission to make Jesus known to every man, woman, and child. To carry out that philosophy, the church planting team and I are committed to resourcing, mobilizing, and equipping church planters and their churches to carry out the vision God has assigned them.

When spending time with church planters, we get to the nuts and bolts of church planting. Many come with great intentions, but when things fall out of order, it becomes evident that there was no firm foundation built. As a leader and church planter, it's important to know where you're heading so you can direct your time and energy to that end. One of the ways to keep focus is through prayer to help the planter discern God's path for the years ahead. It is during prayer time God's Word will be a lamp upon their feet and a light on their path (Psalm 119:105).

While we didn't know for certain what God had in store for 2021, we did know that He was still working. With the presence of Covid-19 and Covid-Delta still ravaging our nation, getting the gospel out to the masses is of Kingdom importance. Amid this crisis, we remember the words Apostle Paul penned: But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.³⁸ Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord (1 Corinthians 15:57-58 NKJV).

This is where the church planting team comes in to assist church planters to become more creative in reaching neighborhoods and communities. Amid the pandemic and growth in Nashville we know that church planters and their teams need assistance with the plans and strategies given by God. Once a church planter aligns with God and agrees to the process, we know that God begins putting things in motion. I believe that this pandemic has caused us to rethink and reimagine our approach to worship, outreach, and church gatherings to embrace new methods and styles to present the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Over this past year we have still made significant impacts in recruiting, coaching, assessing, equipping, and resourcing our NBA church planters. As I took time with church planters and bi-vocational planters during this time, I was able to assist them with regathering strategies, leadership development, MissionInsite demographics, membership assimilation, discipleship and leveraging technology.

Church Planting Process:

We understand that church planting is not for everyone (Matthew 22:14) and not to be done alone (Ephesians 4:11-13). Our goal is to build and plant healthy churches to multiply the Body of Christ in the earth realm. To establish this motto, we must begin with healthy church planters, healthy partnerships, basic training, and church planter coaching.

Revitalization Team

Revitalization is one of our four priority areas, helping existing churches navigate their journey forward: We facilitate new life in churches that are in transition through discerning, resourcing, and bringing clarity to God's purpose and vision for their future.

The Team: The NBA has formed a Church Strengthening Team (CST) that is comprised of local pastors and lay leaders who are committed to conveying next level initiatives and transformation that activates ripple effects of church growth and new life.

The Approach: The CST is here to work with you and get clarity through hearing your story of the current condition of the church. It's at that intersection we map out what's next. We are not here to dominate, we are here to coach, identify, advise and do ministry with you. Through that information exchange, the CST will develop and provide a customized strategy to dig the wells of living water again in your church (Genesis 26:18). Let's collaborate and create a path for church growth together. Please don't hesitate to contact our CST.

The Fundamentals: Churches that seek help must consider the following fundamentals:

First, there is not a quick or an easy answer. Understanding your story is our first task. Strengthening your church requires change, which can be time consuming and difficult.

Secondly, the team will get an accurate picture of the church's current condition and create a church portfolio.

Thirdly, CST will give recommendations to church leadership, toward "What is God's best for the church?'

Finally, when the CST has done its due diligence in assessing the condition of the church, then we communicate the findings to congregations in a helpful way.

We have had conversations with four churches this year that are in various stages of the revitalization process. Please pray for healthy churches that will adopt a struggling church to help them move to a better future in serving Christ in their location.

Connections

The purpose of the Connections priority is to bring together leaders, resources, and missional strategies in partnership between churches. We plan to do this through consistent communication, strategic networking and intentional relationship building.

This focus is a part of and works together with the other 3 Focus Areas of the NBA. This past year our goal of hiring a new staff person to guide our Connections Ministry was put on hold due to Covid-19. However, the focus remains vital and alive through our Toy Store, Disaster Relief, Ministry Assistants/Secretaries, VBS, Bible Drill, WMU and many more.

As you may notice, we don't have any updated statistics for 2020's Toy Store, because we weren't able to have one!

In 2019, we changed location from Shelby Avenue Baptist Church to Hope Church (previously Eastland Baptist Church). We look forward to working with Hope Church again in 2022.

Despite the challenges 2020 brought, some individual churches were able to keep the spirit of the Toy Store alive in the NBA.

Crievewood Baptist served their community with Christmas Blessing and helped 30 families. Grace Baptist distributed toys, gifts, and food to 14 families as part of their Christmas Mission. New Season was able to serve 10 families with toys and give out 500 backpacks to children in apartments near their church.



At our next meeting we will be planning for the "World Day of Prayer," which will be November 1, 2021, at Brookhollow Baptist Church.


MISSION NSITE
