Board of Directors

The Board of Directors of the Nashville Baptist Association has been honored to serve the churches of our association another year. Our desire is to exercise good stewardship over the vision and organizational matters of the association, as well as the resources so generously provided by the churches for associational missions.

The achievements of the past year should be put in the context of the previous years, beginning with the Vision 20/20 plan and the reorganization of the association, which led to the executive leadership transition we have recently completed.

Vision 20/20

The work of the Vision 20/20 plan began in 2018. The association adopted its newly stated purpose, which is to partner with churches around the priorities of church leadership health, church connections for ministry, church planting, and church revitalization.

Reorganization

The association then adopted the new governing structure and bylaws for the NBA. The Board of Directors is a direct result of these changes in the association over the past three years.

Executive Leadership Transition

In 2021-22, the Board of Directors began working with Rusty Sumrall to develop a plan to transition the executive leadership of the association. Rusty has served the NBA for thirty years and plans to retire in March 2023.

We are happy to report that this transition is complete. The Board of Directors led a thorough search process and the association affirmed Michael Kelley as the new Executive Director of the NBA. We welcome Michael and commit ourselves to pray for him and support his leadership.

Today, the NBA is pursuing a clear mission with key priorities for serving churches in Greater Nashville. The work of the association is organized and directed by an effective governing structure and bylaws, and the key leadership is in place to serve the churches of the association in the future.

We thank God for His leadership in these days.

We also thank Rusty Sumrall for his vision and humility to initiate these transition plans as he prepared to retire from his service to the NBA. These accomplishments would not have happened without his leadership.

It has been our privilege to serve the kingdom of Christ and the churches of our association this past year.

Praise God for His blessings during the past 30 years!

The Lord is my strength and my shield, my heart trusts in Him, and He helps me. My heart leaps for joy, and with my song I praise Him. –Psalm 28:7

I thank you and I praise God for blessing me with the opportunity to serve you through the NBA during the past 30 years.

I began my leadership on March 1, 1993 as the Church Development Director. During the years I was in this role, I was blessed to work with many wonderful church leaders as we created a youth lock-in called Ska-mo-bow with 600 youth attending each lock-in. We began fellowship groups for youth ministers, children's ministers, and Christian Education Directors.

I was honored to lead 13 churches through a Refocus strategy process. In 2004, Mike Overcash helped begin our Disaster Relief Ministry, which grew to two units (a chainsaw and a shower trailer). We partnered with NAMB to bring World Changers and P2 Missions to Nashville.

We reached a record 200 participants in Bible Drill and Speakers Tournament, and 1,200 customers in the NBA Toy Store.

While I was leading the Church Development Ministry of the NBA, I was also blessed to serve as a Secretary/Treasurer, Vice-President, and President of the Metro Association of Religious Education Directors and Vice-President of The Tennessee Baptist Christian Education Association.

My position as Church Development Director expanded to Associate Executive Director. In 2005, the NBA called me as the new Executive Director after the retirement of Jim Freedman.

My ministry as the Executive Director has given me the opportunity to lead the NBA through four strategy plan processes. We have moved from a program-based organization to resourcing, networking, and assisting churches and church leaders. As the Executive Director of the NBA, I was honored to lead missions partnerships with Chicago, Cincinnati, Puerto Rico, Indonesia, and Guatemala.

In 2006 God spoke to me in my local Wal-Mart with a challenge to reach the people coming to Nashville from the many nations of our world. As a result of this encounter, we created the *Peoples of Nashville* book and challenged NBA churches to reach 30 unreached groups in Nashville.

The Legacy Church Ministry is a result of my vision for churches to carry on ministry after they have disbanded or merged with a stronger church. Six of our NBA churches have set up Legacy Funds with the Tennessee Baptist Foundation. The interest from these funds will be used to carry on ministry in Nashville.

Our Disaster Relief Ministry has sent teams to Oklahoma, Texas, Mississippi, Louisiana, Florida, Kentucky, Alabama, and Tennessee.

Some of the most rewarding parts of my ministry have been coaching and mentoring pastors, training pastor search teams, calming church conflicts, assisting declining churches, and guiding churches through strategy planning.

I have been blessed to lead your wonderful staff who have been dedicated to serve NBA churches and leaders.

Nashville Baptist Association has a great future with many exciting opportunities and challenges.

The past year has been a transition year for the NBA. Your Board continued enacting the 20/20 Vision plan by searching for and hiring your next Executive Director.

Michael Kelley joined the NBA staff on May 1, 2022 as Executive Director Elect. During the last five months, I have been available to help Michael become oriented and welcomed into the NBA.

Tonight it is my honor to pass the leadership of the NBA to Michael. I look forward to the next five months as I remain on staff to assist Michael until my retirement on March 1, 2023.

Moving Forward Together

Time and time again in Scripture we are told how to treat “one another.” We are to love, honor, bear the burdens of, forgive, care for, serve, along with a host of other things. These “one anothers” are an essential component of the Christian life. God does not intend for us to live in isolation, but instead wills for His children to grow up in Christ together, spurring one another on to good deeds, bearing one another’s burdens, and deeply loving and appreciating each other’s unique contributions to the body of Christ.

While this is true at an individual level, it’s also true in the lives of entire churches. As autonomous churches, we can choose to either live, grow, and be on mission in isolation, or we can choose to cooperate together as an association of churches. We can choose to live similar “one anothers” as churches that we live as individuals.

Imagine a network of churches so closely linked together in the city that it, through its collective influence and resources, actually changes the overall trajectory of the metro area. Imagine regional pastors in deep and encouraging friendships with one another. Imagine groups of churches coming to the aid of other local churches in need. Imagine church leaders helping each other grow in their skills and aptitudes. We can move forward together, and in particular, move forward in four priority areas.

Connections

The NBA will connect churches by bringing together leaders, resources, and missional strategies in partnership between churches. We will do this together by creating vibrant and dynamic fellowship through consistent communication, strategic networking, and intentional relationship building. When we are able to connect churches together, we are able to multiply ministry. We are able to accomplish more together than we can individually.

Recently, we have seen this happen through facilitating the next phase of the ministry of the Nashville Baptist Association Toy Store. Rather than having a centrally located store, we are multiplying that ministry by equipping various local churches through training and funding to facilitate their own toy stores throughout the Nashville area. This kind of multiplication will be a model for our work going forward as we seek to help churches share resources, expertise, and learning with each other.

This coming year, look for the launch of monthly peer learning webinars in which we will tap the great knowledge and skill base of our local church leaders in order to multiply that learning into the lives of other local churches.

Leaders

Healthy leaders are relational leaders, and through relationships, the NBA will seek to care for our pastors and church staff members. The NBA will help to facilitate this type of healthy leadership by seeing to it that every pastor and minister in our network is encouraged in their work, connected to other pastors and ministers, and cared for in the context of their specific needs.

Fortunately, there are several groups like this currently meeting in Nashville. These groups serve as safe places for pastors and ministry staff to share their unique burdens and leadership challenges with their peers in order to be encouraged and prayed for.

In the coming year, look for an expansion of these groups to ensure there are regional opportunities for pastors to meet, encourage, and fellowship with one another.

Church Planting

Reproducing is one of the signs of vitality. In a church context, planting is a sign of health and life. As such, the NBA will assist in birthing new churches around our city by helping identify locations, assessing planters, training leaders, and securing funding in order to see faithful congregations in every community in Nashville.

But not only will the NBA work with church planters this coming year; we will also expand our work with planting churches. Here is another opportunity for churches to come together and marshal their resources, because churches don't have to plant other churches alone. The NBA will help to facilitate groups of churches working together to plant churches in underserved regions of middle Tennessee.

Church Revitalization

The Nashville Baptist Association is not only committed to helping churches plant churches; we are committed to helping existing churches through revitalization. In this, we will help congregations to discern, resource, and bring clarity to God's purpose and vision for their future. There are several ways for us to do this work together: We will facilitate church mergers, help churches leave a legacy for future congregations, and bring resources together to breathe new life into congregations.

Currently, the NBA is involved in such a process with one local congregation. We are working to identify several churches to have a sponsoring relationship with this congregation. The sponsoring churches will contribute expertise, guidance, finances, and people resources to that effort. By coming together, we can care for each other and maintain a gospel presence in the growing communities of Nashville.

Church Planting Strategist

The NBA has a mission to cultivate and connect church planters and churches throughout Middle Tennessee, in order to set the pace in healthy church plants through our Churches Planting Churches initiative. As one of our four priority areas, Church Planting assists both planters and churches on the path to thrive and multiply.

Over the past year the Church Planting Team assisted new church planter Pastor Patrick Williams of Redemption Fellowship in Ashland City. Patrick, his wife Allison, and their two daughters moved from Missoula, Montana to start a church in Tennessee. Their sponsoring church is First Baptist Church Joelton, where Patrick is in residency and on staff.

In June, Patrick's church held an outreach event at an Ashland City apartment complex with the help of members from First Baptist Pleasant Grove.



In March of 2022, the Nashville Baptist Association Church Planting Team sponsored a 2-day Church Growth Training that was hosted at Inglewood Baptist Church. This was a time of meaningful Kingdom interactions, through an intensive journey of exploring strategic issues of the church and its processes for maximum impact. This training provided foundational strategies, planning components, and principles of church planting and church growth. There was no hype, no theory, just practical "how to" church growth tools and techniques. Facilitators for this training were Rusty Sumrall, Dwayne Lewis, Lewis McMullen, Aaron Schwartz, and Dre Burgs.



In July, we sponsored lunch for some of our NBA pastors to meet with incoming Executive Director Michael Kelley at the NBA office.



Broadmoor Baptist Church, under Pastor Matthew Harris, has renovated their former youth area and will be renting it out to another NBA church, Nehemiah Missionary Baptist Church. I have been walking alongside these two churches, Pastor Harris, and Pastor Thomas Hunter for over six months collaborating this opportunity for Nehemiah to have its own worship space.

International Ministry Strategist

After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people, and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. —Revelation 7:9

Nashville has a large and diverse immigrant population. Hispanics make up over 10% of the population and those with Asian heritage around 4%. Nashville also has the largest Kurdish population in the United States. The Nashville Baptist Association has over thirty churches that worship in a language other than English. Each one represents one nation that we will worship with in heaven.

Since joining the Association in August of 2022, I have been able to visit many of these churches and meet their pastors. I have also been invited to preach at a number of them. Each of these churches has its various struggles and hardships. Several of them have lost members to COVID or had members move out of state. Most of these pastors work part-time or full-time jobs to not be a burden on their small congregations. Despite the challenges, I often leave visits with these pastors encouraged because of their perseverance, faithfulness, and joy.

Here are a few of the highlights from this year:

I was asked to preach on Christmas Eve to the Zomi church that meets in the Nolensville area. We met at one of their houses and I was soon seated to a great feast of Zomi food: whole chickens, cubed pork, Lo Mein, and Burmese Roselle sour soup. I taught from the first chapter of Matthew, about the birth of a king. This long-awaited King, born in the humblest of circumstances was honored by the wisest from the East. This King would spend his first few years as a refugee in Egypt fleeing from a usurper to the throne.

This spring I was able to line up a meeting between Frank Urroz and Bob Cook. Frank is the pastor of Hispana Gallatin, a Spanish-speaking fellowship, which meets at the First Baptist Church of Gallatin. Bob Cook is the longtime pastor of The Church at Grace Park and a dear friend of the Association. Pastor Frank works full-time construction at different sites in downtown Nashville. Like most of our ethnic pastors, he is bi-vocational, working to support his family while preparing for Sunday sermons at night. Bob's compassion led him to offer Frank two roles at Grace Park. Frank now serves the church and school at Grace Park as a handyman and has started a Bible study for Spanish speakers in Goodlettsville. I hope that we can find many more partnerships like this.

One of our long-term pastors, Oscar Aguilar of Iglesia Bautista Nueva Vida, suffered a stroke in January and was hospitalized at Vanderbilt for several weeks. After Oscar returned home, he was confined to a wheelchair. The Association, with the help of Paul Vawter of Tennessee Baptist Disaster Relief, was able to build him a wheelchair ramp in one day this April. Oscar, Miriam, and their son John are very thankful for all the help they received from the Association and local pastors. Serving the church or pastors in need is the very heart of Nashville Baptist.

In April the Nashville Baptist Association office hosted a small group of ethnic church pastors and laymen for leadership training. This was the first event of its kind in more than five years. Fady Al-Hagal, who leads the International Leadership Coalition and is the multiplication minister at Brentwood Baptist Church, led three sessions on leadership. These included effective habits of a leader, making spirit-led decisions, and endurance in the ministry. I also led a session on humility in leadership and the roles of New Testament leadership. All were well received, and we had good questions and discussions at the table.

We hope to hold more training events this year and in the future. There is a need for good church training for the ethnic churches of Nashville. Several of the pastors have asked for youth and children's ministry training for their churches. There are also needs for church operations training, which would include legal and tax help, retirement planning, and the like.

While these ethnic churches of Nashville need training and fellowship, many of them have much to offer in terms of teaching and training the American church. How can we learn from them in terms of persecution, refugee ministries, world religions, evangelism, and discipleship among their people groups?

Ministry Reports

Toy Store

The Nashville Baptist Association Toy Store is a legacy ministry in our city. Since 1951, families have had the opportunity to shop for toys and other household items for Christmas as well as hear the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The NBA Toy Store also has an exciting and expansive future ahead.

Our desire is for the ministry of the NBA Toy Store to be expanded into many local churches throughout Nashville, so that there is not just one location to which families can come and shop, but many locations all across the city.

On Saturday, September 10, the NBA was able to host a training session for churches interested in beginning or continuing their own toy store ministry. This training was led by Michael Kelley and long-time NBA Toy Store director Pat Malone, and was attended by representatives from five area churches. The session was also filmed and will be available for churches interested in beginning this ministry in the future. Churches who either attended or watch this training in the future will be eligible for financial help from the NBA to help with their ministry.

NBA Woman's Missionary Union exemplified the definition of our theme this year: Relentless. We were relentless, in spite of various hardships experienced by our team members, churches, and areas across the association, organizing and participating various church ministries reaching out to our respective communities as well as going to other areas to help spread the Gospel in many ways. Some specific activities your NBA WMU held included the following:

Baptist Women's World Day of Prayer was held at Brook Hollow Baptist Church on November 1st, 2021. NBA WMU gathered to partner with other women in the Baptist World Alliance Women's Department (BWAWD) to pray for the World. Attendees also brought items for the Tennessee Baptist Children's Home in Brentwood, heard about the work in Spain from John and Jennifer Vanover and collected an offering for the BWAWD Day of Prayer projects across the seven continental unions. The next Day of Prayer event will be at Donelson First Baptist on November 7, 2022 at 10 am.

In December, due to Covid limitations, the NBA was not able to host the annual Christmas Toy Store. To offset the loss of this ministry to one community in Nashville, NBA WMU developed the Nashville Hope Pack - pillowcases with items for children from 4-12 for Christmas. 150+ pillowcases were collected and packed by NBA churches and NBA WMU women for distribution by New Season Church. Please pray for every church in the association to find their place this holiday season to reach out to their respective communities or help reach out to another community.

In April, NBA WMU held our Annual Celebration at Tulip Grove to celebrate another year of being Relentless. We collected items for Begin Anew to celebrate the 25th anniversary of this NBA WMU ministry. We also learned of other ministries around the association, the state and the world. The 2022-23 team of Cynthia Scott, Director, and Brian Holt, RA/Challengers was elected.

This summer online training sessions were provided by TBMB and National WMU. NBA WMU members participated in these sessions. 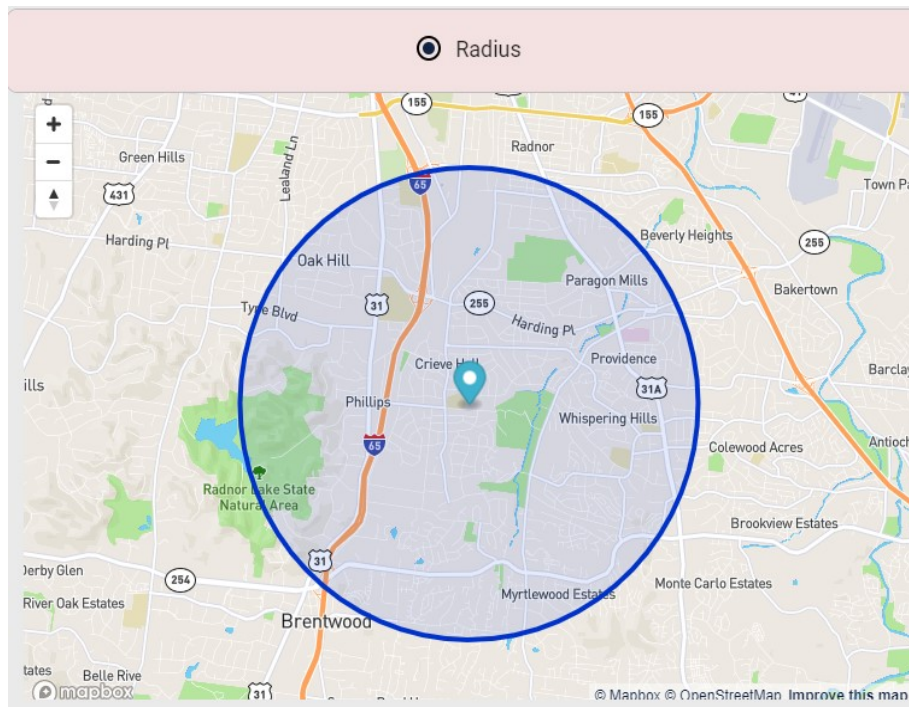
MissionInsite provides statistical data and information on Religious/Spiritual Attitudes and Practices, Social and Moral Values, and the Faith Involvement of those in our communities.
