1 Corinthians 2:1-5: "When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come with superior eloquence or wisdom as I proclaimed the testimony of God. For I decided to be concerned about nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. And I was with you in weakness and in fear and with much trembling. My conversation and my preaching were not with persuasive words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith would not be based on human wisdom but on the power of God."

Is there a quote that has stuck with you and influenced the way you have thought or behaved?

I love this quote from a letter John Newton wrote to a young pastor he was mentoring: "Be not discouraged: usefulness and trials, comforts and crosses, strength and exercise go together. But remember he has said, 'I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee; be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life.' When you get to heaven, you will not complain of the way by which the Lord brought you."

What is one exciting thing God is doing in your church right now?

Now two years into a church merger, it's wonderful to see how God is stitching our church together. Transitions like ours can be tough for everyone in different ways. They take time and patience. But most of all they require the supernatural work that God loves to do through his Word. We've kept our focus on Jesus, and through him on one another, and it is clear that God is drawing us together around him.
